Role of Boards -- Legal

- Funds, properties & assets vest in Board
- Acquaintance with & advance the aims & objects or mission & vision
- Operate the organization within the framework of the organization's own charter and the statutes governing the organization





Role of Boards -- Legal

- Should not derive personal benefit from the organization
- Remuneration?
- Jointly and severally responsible
- Oversee & Review functioning and financials
- Set policy through process of periodic meetings and resolutions





Role Of Boards -- General

- Provide leadership / vision
- Give the organization a sense of direction
- Set the policy
- Take responsibility
- Hold the organization together
- Be a Sound Board for the CEO / ED



Role Of Boards -- General

- Mobilize resources
- Build & nurture an ethical, sensitive, motivated & responsible team
- Discourage exaggerated or misleading claims

Good Boards

- Have interest in the work of the organization
- Have commitment to the organization's aims and objects
- Have reasonable intelligence and competence
- Respected in the community and by all stakeholders





Good Boards

- Respect the right of other board members and staff to differ/disagree
- Dissent, if necessary, but accept with grace the majority decision or step down
- Effectively mobilize and properly channel resources



Governance is mainly linked to:

- **Accountability / transparency**
- **Self-regulation**
- **Organizational sustainability**



Good Board Qualities

- Flexibility (except on matters of core principles and values)
- Open to new ideas
- Enthusiasm
